## Move-in Process

#### Early Arrivals

- f Must be approved and begin as early as September
- f Arrive any time 24/7 and in almost all cases move to their Fall Quarter assignment
- f \$50 a night
- f Students check in with the emailed Selfeck In link
  - 9 Stop byyour Area Desk if you need\addidcard, to check out a moving cart, or for general questions
  - 9 No movein assistance is available for early arrivals

#### Move-In Process- September 17

- f Print themove-in permitand place on your dashboard (if you are driving)
  - f Permits are scheduled to be emailed on September 6
- f Complete the SelCheck In Form that will be emailed to you on the morning of September 17
- f Arrive to your designated unloading zone at the time on the move permit (if driving) or go straight to building f not in a vehicle
  - Do not drive to your buildinguse the address provided for the unloading zone on the movie permit and on the movien website

#### Move-In Process- September 17

- f Professional movers will meet you at your vehicle and move iterthset com
  - f Once unloaded, one person must move youhicle to a longerm parking location
    - f North Campus Parking Garage, South Campus Parking Garatte, Campus Parking Structure
    - f Ryan Fielda shuttle is available throughout the day
      - f Peer Advisers will hand you a map while you are in your unloading zo
- f Quickly meet RAs as you enter your building lobby and complete the first you have not yet done so
- f Tap your card on your door, wait 60 seconds, then tap again
- f Goto your room and unpack
  - f Notime limit, but events start at 4:00 p.m.
- f Visit the Wildcat Welcome Center in the Louis Room of the Norris University Center
- f Need assistance? Talk to a Resident Assistant or visit your Area Desk.
